

Integrated Reintegration Iraq (Kurdistan Region)

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) is carrying out, with the support of the German Federal Office for Migration and Refugees and the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund, a project aimed at assisting the return and long-term social and economic reintegration of Iraqi nationals in the area of the Kurdish Regional Government (KRG).

Project Duration

The project will run from 1 June 2015 to 30 June 2017.

Target Group

Iraqi nationals with strong and intact family ties in the KRG wishing to return voluntarily to the area are welcome to apply. Special consideration will be given to vulnerable individuals, applicants with large families or dependents. Additionally, applicants need to qualify for the REAG/GARP program, which can provide financial and logistical return assistance to returnees and their families.

Reintegration of Returnees

Individual reintegration needs will be drafted in the application form and discussed with IOM prior to departure. After their return, applicants will be counselled by IOM reintegration experts and supported in concretizing their reintegration plans, allowing for individual needs and potential vulnerability. Following approval by the German Federal Office for Migration and Refugees, applicants with feasible and economic proposals will be supported in their reintegration through counselling, in-kind grants and follow-up support lasting several months.

The project can provide individualized reintegration support, which may include:

- In-Kind Grants for micro-enterprise development;
- Specialized training such as vocational or on-the-job training;
- Housing-related support;
- Assistance for persons with special vulnerability, such as medical needs.

Additionally, returnees have the possibility to benefit from:

- Transportation assistance at arrival;
- Airport pick-up in individual cases;
- Counseling and mentoring services on social matters;
- Practical support in the search for schools as well as medical and psychological support.
